AN ACT TO AMEND 4 G.C.A., § 8121(a), RELATIVE TO THE ANNUITY PAYMENTS AND EXCEPTING SUSPENSION OF CERTIFIED AUGMENTATION TEACHING SERVICE EMPLOYEES (CATS) FROM THE SUSPENSION; TO ADD A NEW 17 G.C.A., § 3103(q) RELATIVE TO PROMULGATING RULES & REGULATIONS FOR THE CATS ACT; TO ADD A NEW 17 G.C.A. § 3127 RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING DEFINITIONS FOR THE CATS ACT; TO ADD A NEW 17 G.C.A. § 3128 RELATIVE TO ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR CERTIFIED TEMPORARY EMPLOYEE STATUS; TO ADD A NEW 17 G.C.A. § 3129 RELATIVE TO THE CERTIFICATE OF NECESSITY FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF CATS; TO STATE A FINDING OF THE IMPRACTICABILITY OF ALLOWING CATS TO BE EMPLOYED AS CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES; TO ADD A NEW 17 G.C.A. § 3130 RELATIVE TO THE MAINTENANCE OF AN EMPLOYMENT ROSTER BY THE SUPERINTENDENT; TO ADD A NEW 17 G.C.A. § 3131 RELATIVE TO THE REPLACEMENT OF TO ADD A SUNSET CATS BY CERTIFIED APPLICANTS: PROVISION EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2010; TO **ENACT** THE CERTIFIED AUGMENTATION TEACHER SERVICE (CATS) ACT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section One. Short title. This act may be cited as The Certified Augmentation Teacher

  Service (CATS) Act or the CATS Act.
- 4 Section Two. Statement of legislative purpose. The purpose of this act is to augment
- 5 certified personnel, as identified in Item 12 of Title 1 G.C.A., Chapter 7, §715, within the Guam
- 6 Public School System with government of Guam retirees who meet the eligibility requirements
- 7 set out in Section Six of this Act, in order to assist with the full compliance with the Every Child
- 8 is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act for the next three school years.

Section Three. Suspension of Annuity Payments. Title 4 G.C.A. § 8121(a) is amended to read:

"(a) A retired member who subsequently becomes an employee eligible for membership under § 8106 of this Title prior to January 1, 1999 shall, upon becoming so employed, have that member's right to receive payment of that member's annuity suspended for the duration of that member's employment, but all other rights pertaining to that member's annuity provided by this Article, including automatic increases therein, shall be retained by that member. The provisions of this Section shall not be applicable to any retired Judge or Justice designated and assigned by the Chief Justice to perform judicial duties in the courts of Guam as provided for in § 6115 of Title 7 G.C.A., or any person employed by the Guam Public School System in Guam schools such as a substitute teacher; classroom teacher; guidance counselor; health counselor; or certified, registered and/or licensed health professionals, including, but-not-limited to, physical therapists, audiologists, speech pathologists, speech clinicians, physicians, physician assistants, nurses or psychologists; when such critical need arises; provided, that such person(s) occupies a position for which no other qualified/certified applicant was available, and that or as a Certified Augmentation Teaching Service (CATS) employee as that that term is defined by Title 17 G.C.A. § 3127(b). such Such employment shall be on a school-year basis, subject to the provisions of Items (d) and (e) of this Section

The provisions of this Section shall not be applicable to any certified, registered or licensed health care professional, or ancillary service personnel, employed by the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, and the Department of Public Health and Social Services; provided, that such person occupies a position for which no qualified applicants were available, and provided that such employment is procured on an annual basis, subject to the provisions of Subsection (d) of this Section."

**Section Four. Rules.** A new Title17 GCA § 3103(q) is added to read:

"(q) to promulgate rules and regulations for the implementation and operation of §§ 3127 through 3131 of this title as necessary."

**Section Five. Definitions.** A new Title 17 G.C.A., § 3127 is added to read:

"§3127. Definitions: As used in Title 4 G.C.A., Chapter 8, § 8121(a) and §§ 3127 through 3131 of this Title.

- 1 (a) Certified Employee means an employee who holds a position defined in 1 GCA § 715 2 Item 12. (a) through (e) and (k) who is "certified" as that term is defined in 1 GCA § 715 Item 3 13.
- 4 (b) Certified Augmentation Teaching Service (CATS) employee(CAT or CATS) means a member of the Government of Guam Employees' Retirement Fund who has retired from 5 6 government service but has subsequently been temporarily employed as an unclassified 7 employee to fill a vacancy in a position defined in 1 GCA § 715 Item 12. (a) through (e) and (k) who is "certified" as that term is defined in 1 GCA § 715 Item 13. for the remainder of a school 8 9 year or until replaced pursuant to 17 GCA § 3131.
- 10 (c) Certified Applicant means an applicant for a position defined in 1 GCA § 715 Item 11 12. (a) through (e) and (k) who is "certified" as that term is defined in 1 GCA § 715 Item 13.

- (d) Certificate of Necessity means a writing signed by the Superintendent that the employment of a Certified Temporary Employee is necessary to fill a vacant position defined in 1 GCA §715 Item 12. (a) through (e) and (k) in order to comply with the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act.
- (e) Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act means the provisions of 17 Public Law 28-45."
- 18 (f) School year means 180 instructional days as that term is qualified in 1 GCA § 715, 19 Item 12(m).
  - Section Six. Eligibility for CATS Employee Status. A new Title 17 G.C.A., § 3128 is added to read:
  - "§ 3128. Eligibility for CATS Employee Status. A former Guam Public School System employee who resigned or retired from a position defined in 17 G.C.A. § 715 Item 12. (a) through (e) and (k) in good standing:
  - (a) while the Guam Public Schools were in their annual summer recess, and who gave thirty (30) days' notice before leaving his employment, may be employed as a CAT Certified Temporary Employee if he holds a current certification for the position, or
  - (b) prior to the effective date of this act may be employed as a CATS employee if he holds a current certification for the position."
- 30 Section Seven. Employment of CATS Employees. A new Title 17 G.C.A., §3129 is 31 added to read:

1 "§ 3129. Employment of CATS employees.

- 2 (a) The Superintendent of Education shall, to the extent possible, fill all positions defined 3 in Title 17 G.C.A. § 715 Item 12 (a) through (e) and (k) with Certified Employees.
  - (b) In the absence of Certified Employees the Superintendent may employ CATS. Before he employs a CAT the Superintendent shall issue and post on the Guam Public School System website a Certificate of Necessity."
  - Section Eight. Superintendent to Maintain Roster. A new Title 17 G.C.A., § 3130 is added to read:
  - "§ 3130. Superintendent to Maintain Roster. The Superintendent shall establish, keep current and post on the Guam Public School System website a roster of all positions required by the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act to be filled by a Certified Employee as that term is defined by Title 17 G.C.A. § 715 Item 13. The roster shall indicate which positions are vacant, which positions are filled with Certified Employees, which positions are filled with CATS and the Certificate of Necessity for each CAT pursuant to Title 17 G.C.A. §3129(b)."
  - **Section Nine.** Employment of Certified Applicants. A new Title 17 G.C.A., § 3131 is added to read:
  - "§ 3131. Employment of Certified Applicants. When a Certified Applicant who is available for employment for the remainder of a current school year is available to fill a position occupied by a CAT, the Superintendent shall forthwith replace the CAT with a Certified Applicant if at least ten weeks remain in the current semester, otherwise at the end of the current semester."
  - **Section Ten.** Impracticability. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that because of the necessity for recruiting retirees on short notice for positions which have limited tenure with no expectation of continuing employment, it would be impracticable to employ CATS as classified employees.
    - Section Eleven. Sunset provision. No CAT may be employed after July 1, 2010.

#### **Overview:**

The Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations, and Reorganization held a public hearing on Bill 375(EC) on November 27, 2006 at 9:00am in the Guam Legislature public hearing room in Hagatna, Guam. Notice of public hearing was disseminated throughout all local media.

#### Senators present:

Senator Robert Klitzkie, chairman Senator Adolpho Palacios, member Senator Larry Kasperbauer, member Senator Judith Won Pat

#### Findings & recommendations:

Three officials, Superintendent Luis S.N. Reyes, Legal Counsel Fred Nishihira, and Associate Superintendent for Secondary Schools, Kenneth P. Chargualaf, from the Guam Public School System, testified in favor of Bill 375(EC).

Superintendent Reyes' testimony was the most comprehensive, by stating:

"Additionally, CATS greatly assist management of GPSS by requiring those potential CATS candidates to be ready to serve students at the beginning of a new school year as opposed to the beginning of a new fiscal year."

Reyes was endorsing Title 17 G.C.A., §3128 as set out in §6 of the bill which reads in pertinent part:

"§ 3128. Eligibility for CATS Employee Status. A former Guam Public School System employee who resigned or retired from a position defined in 17 G.C.A. § 715 Item 12. (a) through (e) and (k) in good standing:

(a) while the Guam Public Schools were in their annual summer recess, and who gave thirty (30) days' notice before leaving his employment, may be employed as a CAT Certified Temporary Employee if he holds a current certification for the position, or... [emphasis supplied]

Reyes' testimony goes on to explain that many who decide to retire do so on 30 September, *i.e.* 45 days into a new school year. He continues by explaining that this practice is "extremely disruptive to the child's education." From another viewpoint Reyes characterizes the current practice as "...a nightmare as far as trying to fill the vacant position..." Reyes expands on this theme by stating that if the retiree were a principal, a whole school would be disrupted. Reyes also notes that "...the current situation corners GPSS into the position of having to rehire retiring teachers...." The effect of the adoption of §6 on recruitment is summarized by Reyes as "...much easier to recruit before a new school begins as opposed to a month and a half after a new school year has begun."

Superintendent Reyes stated that transparency is one of his principles of management and praised the transparency features of the bill both for the sake of transparency itself and as an aid in recruitment.

Superintendent Reyes closed by stating:

"Finally, with a short fuse of July 10, 2010, GPSS has an incentive to step up recruitment for certified positions required by the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Education Act."

Associate Superintendent Chargualaf's testimony commented on the effects of several public laws but did not address the substance of Bill 375.

Testimony submitted by the Public School System's Legal Counsel, Fred Nishihira, stated that the enactment of Bill 375 would help the System comply with the mandates of the Every Child Is Entitled To An Adequate Public Education Act, the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, and the No Child Left Behind Act.

Attorney Nishihira suggested that the bill be amended to allow for the employment as CATS for government employees who retired from agencies other than the public schools and who hold appropriate certifications.

Having considered the testimony of the witnesses and according great weight to the testimony of the Superintendent of Education, the committee finds that the Bill 375 should be passed as introduced. While the suggestion of Attorney Nishihira is interesting, the committee concludes that, if effective at all, the provision would only provide a new supply of retirees for a short time (until 2010) and could cause morale problems amongst the professional staff of the public schools.

**RE: TESTIMONY ON BILL NO. 375** 

Hafa Adai! Mr. Chairman, Committee Members and Senators:

In addition to my oral testimony in support of Bill 375, I am submitting written testimony to further expound on why the Guam Public School System (GPSS) needs a Certified Augmentation Teacher Service Act (CATS).

On October 1, 2007 the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Education Act will become fully effective. In part the Act rightfully requires that GPSS have fully certified teachers, administrators, guidance counselors, school health counselors, allied health professionals and librarians. CATS assist GPSS for the next three years by authorizing the use of fully certified retirees to fill the positions enumerated in 1 G.C.A. §715 Item 12 (a) through (e) and (k). Additionally CATS greatly assist management of GPSS by requiring those potential CATS candidates to be ready to serve students at the beginning of a new school year as opposed to the beginning of a new fiscal year.

Currently GPSS hires retired teachers (double dippers) to serve as classroom teachers. Many of those who decide to double dip effectuate their retirement on September 30 or about 45 days into a new school year. As you can imagine this practice is extremely disruptive to a child's education. Likewise from an administrative point of view the current practice is a nightmare as far as trying to fill the vacated position and process all paper work for the outgoing employee, the incoming employee and all this at a time when GPSS is usually in serious budgetary hearings at the legislature. As one can

see the current situation corners GPSS into the position of having to rehire retiring teachers to prevent a disruption to the classroom. If the retiree is a Principal or Assistant Principal a whole school is disrupted while it transitions to a new administrator. The eligibility provisions or Section Six of the CATS Act require former school employees of GPSS to retire in good standing, while the public schools are in summer recess, with a minimum of thirty (30) days notice and hold a current certificate. With these criteria in place disruptions at schools and classrooms will be reduced. Furthermore, GPSS will be able to determine its staffing needs before the new school year begins and just as important it will allow GPSS to recruit for the vacated positions while candidates are still available. In other words it's much easier to recruit before a new school begins as opposed to a month and a half after a new school year has begun.

The CATS Act also reinforces transparency which is one of my principles of management. Transparency publishes the needs of GPSS as well as how those needs are being met. In order for GPSS to hire a CAT, a roster for all certified positions required by the Every Child Act must be posted on the website. In addition the roster must indicate which positions are vacant, which positions are filled with certified employees, which positions are filled with CATS and a Certificate of Necessity for each CAT. With the implementation of these provisions, potential candidates including off-island candidates can see exactly where vacancies are and thus GPSS may be able to attract more recruits. If new certified recruits do apply for these positions the CAT employee will be replaced unless the replacement would occur ten weeks before then end of the current semester. Once again this provision protects students from a disruption in their education.

Finally, with a short fuse of July 10, 2010, GPSS has an incentive to step up recruitment for all certified positions required by the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Education Act.

Hafa Adai! Mr. Chairman, Committee Members and Senators:

My name is Fred Nishihira. I am the Legal Counsel for the Guam Public School System (GPSS). I am here to testify in **favor** of Bill 375 or the Certified Augmentation Teachers Service Act "CATS".

I have served as legal counsel for GPSS since Senator Kasperbauer was on the Board of Education, when Senator Klitzkie was the Superintendent of Education and while Senator Won Pat was a Principal at a Middle School. During that period, not once have I seen a new School Year begin with a complete number of required certified personnel. The Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Education Act requires qualified personnel and with its full implementation closely approaching, GPSS' shortage of fully certified staff is particularly concerning. Additionally, the established federal requirements of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and the No Child Left Behind Act also require qualified personnel.

Each of the aforementioned Acts will hold GPSS accountable for failing to have qualified personnel to educate our students. To ensure compliance with all statutory requirements regarding qualified personnel, GPSS needs resources to meet this goal. Certified Augmentation Teachers Service Act CATS is a resource that will help GPSS meet the staffing needs of all the federal and local requirements requiring qualified personnel.

Utilizing CATS will allow GPSS to expand the pool of candidates for qualified personnel needs. To ensure that the largest group of people are tapped, the Bill should be expanded to make eligible all retired Government of Guam employees who are **fully certified** to "double dip." For example, Bill 375 could be amended so that a police officer, who retires after 20 years of service, could return to college, earn a degree in teaching and return to GPSS as a teacher, while at the same time collecting her retirement annuity. The students of GPSS would benefit from such an arrangement, and this approach would still meet the federal requirement of qualified personnel as outlined by the No Child

Left Behind Act and Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and the local requirements as described in the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Education Act.

# TESTIMONY ON BILL NO. 375

To the Honorable Robert Klitzkie, Chairman and to the committee members of the Committee on Judiciary, Governmental Operations and Reorganization, I thank you for giving me the opportunity to testify in favor of Bill No. 375. My name is Kenneth P. Chargualaf, I am the Associate Superintendent for Secondary Education Division.

The Guam Public School System (GPSS) proposes to bring to the attention of the Guam Legislature the need to consider the hiring of retired school building administrators under contract. The shortage of school building administrators remains a critical component in the management and operation of the schools. Currently, as of this date, a total of fiftynine (59) school building administrators are under detailed temporary appointment. The following table shows and makes it crystal clear that the Guam Public School System (GPSS) continues to operate with a severe shortage of certified and qualified school building administrators

When the Civil Service Commission approved the recruitment and retention pay incentives policy on November 05, 1998, the Department was very hopeful that its needs would have been fully realized because of the average increase of administrators' salary at approximately seventeen percent (17%) differential pay for recruitment difficulty and retention. Unfortunately, although this incentive differential remains in effect, the salary differential did not significantly improve the Guam Public School's effort in the recruitment of school principals and assistant school principals. The incentive apparently is not nearly enough to recruit and retain fully certified and qualified school building administrators.

Because of the fact that the Guam Public School System is currently experiencing the shortage of school building administrators as the differential pay is not attracting more applicants, we are very fearful that next school year, the shortage of school building administrators will be further exacerbated because of the likelihood and possibility that many of the seasoned school building administrators will retire because of the disincentive imposed by Public Law 27-05. This statute capped the maximum accumulation of annual leave at three hundred twenty (320) hours instead of the four hundred eighty (480) hours. There is a provision that employees upon the approval of the Guam Education Policy Board may retain up to a total of seven hundred twenty (720) hours of annual leave. If the school administrators do not retire on or before September 30, 2007, then they would have lost an incentive to remain in the Guam Public School System. This, in and of itself would drive away the remaining seasoned administrators since they anticipate a big loss in their total earnings as well as retirement credit.

It would be worth mentioning that when the Guam Public School System implemented Public Law 15-138 (a copy attached), the administrators' salary schedule in 1981 all principal and assistant school principal positions were filled. In fact, some principals and assistant school principals wishing to return under reemployment were not hired but instead they take the option of becoming classroom teachers until positions are vacant. The statute fully recognized the fact that a solution must be found quickly and its implementation became a major incentive in the recruitment and retention of school building administrators.

Unfortunately, when Public Law 15-138 was repealed, the Guam Public School System was beginning to see a downward spiral not only in retaining the administrators but recruitment had become very difficult. It is from that point on, when the Guam Public School System began to experience the shortage and remains to this day.

For this reason, that short of increasing the salaries of school building administrators, the Guam Public School System proposes legislation to allow the Department to hire retired school administrators similar to the current authorization in the hiring of teachers and licensed healthcare professionals. Teachers and licensed healthcare professionals are privileged to continue to earn their annuity while at the same time receiving a salary when they are rehired by the Guam Public School System.
